INSTRUCTIONS

1	On or before January 15 th of each year, the owner of every stallion must file a written report showing the names and registration numbers (if applicable) of all mares, including breeding dates, exposed to said stallion through December 31 st of the previous year. Mail to GHRA, Registrar - Stud Report, 3884 County Road 123, Gainseville, TX 76240
2	Submit a separate report for each stallion each year.
3	The report must be submitted on this form, provided free by the GHRA.
4	Include all mares bred whether unregistered or registered with other societies. The owner of the stallion should require a copy of each mare's registration papers in order to facilitate completion of this form.
5	Include all breeding dates or dates of exposure if pasture bred.
6	Include all mares serviced whether owned by the stallion owner or owned by other parties.
7	Be sure the last recorded owner of the mare is the person contracting the breeding to this stallion.
8	Mail this form in no later than January 15 th , if report is postmarked later than January 15 th a \$25 late fee (Plus \$10 per mare) will be charged.

IMPORTANT

If a breeding stallion dies during a current year, his breeding report is due within 30 days of his death.

After a mare has been exposed to a stallion, either hand breeding or pasture breeding, at least 45 days must elapse before exposing the mare to a different stallion.

Separate certifications also required for artificial insemination and embryo transplant.
